From the Archives Galt Theatre

In July of 1948, local developers, Albert Schauer and Eric Speiss, built a state-of-the-art movies theatre for \$75,000. It was to replace the old theatre that had been in existence since the silent movie days and running out of what is now the Valley Oaks Grange Hall. Schauer and Speiss were also the duo responsible for the Galt Frostie (now Mariscos Guamuchil) and had their insurance/real estate office on the north side of the building. The theatre changed hands several times before closing sometime around 1990. The Galt Theatre was located on Lincoln Way between A and C Streets on the east side of the street and is now Sacramento Human Assistance, a county government office. The movie playing at the time was put on by Pacific Telephone and Telegraph (now AT&T) on the safe use of phones by children. It is hard to see but the man on the upper left side of the photo is Laurence Littleton, possibly volunteering as a high school chaperone.

Policy and Procedure Review Whistlebower Policy

I. Purpose

The Galt Area Historical Society officers, members and volunteers are required to observe high standards of business and personal ethics in the conduct of their duties and responsibilities. It is the responsibility of officers, employees, and volunteers to comply with and to report violations or suspected violations of the GAHS bylaws and policies, or federal and state laws in accordance with this policy. No officer, employee, volunteer or contractor who in good faith reports a violation shall suffer harassment, retaliation or adverse employment consequences. Whistleblower Policy is intended to encourage and enable officers and others to raise serious concerns within the GAHS prior to seeking resolution outside the GAHS. This policy is highly recommended by the IRS.

II. Policy

1. Officers, employees, and volunteers should share their questions, concerns, suggestions or complaints with someone who can address them

properly. In most cases, they should report to the President.

2. Any good faith report, concern or complaint is fully protected by this policy, even if after investigation it is not substantiated. Anyone filling out a complaint must be acting in good faith and have reasonable grounds for believing the information disclosed indicates a violation of the GAHS bylaws and policies, or law.

3. Upon the request of the complainant, the GAHS will use its best effort to protect the confidentiality of the complainant for any good faith report. Violations or suspected violations may be submitted anonymously. Reports of violations will be kept confidential to the extent possible, consistent with the need to conduct an adequate investigation.

4. All reports will be promptly investigated and appropriate corrective action will be taken if warranted. The complainant will be informed that follow-up has or is occurring within thirty days. The Board shall be informed of all such complaints or reports.



Giant Orange

Were you aware there was a Giant Orange in Galt? The Giant Orange franchise was a series of drive-in orange juice stands located the length of California's Central Valley. The first was started in Tracy by Frank Pohl in 1926 and, at its peak, there were 16 orange juice stands. The Giant Orange successful at a time when cars had no air conditioning and highways were two lanes with easy off and on access. It was said that a tupical stand could go through 6,000 oranges in a week. Giant Orange began to decline after the invention of car air conditioning and the construction of major freeways. According to someone who worked there, Louise Dowdell, the one in Galt opened in 1935 and could be found on the southwest corner of Lincoln Way and C Street. At the time, the main thoroughfare through Galt was the Lincoln Highway (Lincoln Way), and the stand did a booming business. The Giant Orange stand was moved to 99 and Simmerhorn Road to take advantage of the construction of State Highway 99. When the highway became four lanes, the stand became a memory. Pictured in this 1938 photo are Rella Dowdell, CHP Officer Dave Donaldson, Louise Dowdell, and Manager Eddie Jones.

- 1. Restroom update: Ron and his crew will be finishing the new restrooms and bride's room by Oct 1. It will be a wonderful addition to the McFarland Ranch for the weddings and events. It is a beautiful building and our volunteers worked very hard to complete this project.
- 2. In April 2019, we have a proposal from the National Civil Was Association to rent the McFarland Living History Ranch April 12-April 14, 2019 for a Civil War Reenactment. One day will be for school children; and two days will be open to the public. There will be reenactment battles.
- 3. Car Show coming up September 22. If you have a car, hot rod, custom, motorcycle, old camper trailer 1972 or older, or you have a friend with one, contact Ida for a participation form. Our goal is 100 cars this year.
- 4. Appreciation Dinner for members September 24 at the Rae Museum, starting at 6 pm. Meeting to follow at 7 pm. No cost to members.
- 5. Louise Dowdell's 100th Birthday on August 15 was a great day. Louise had quite a crowd on Sunday, August 12th, as well as on her actual birthday. She received a proclamation from her Great Nephew, Supervisor Don Nottoli, proclaiming Aug 15 as Louise Dowdell Day in Sacramento County. On her birthday she received a call from longtime friend and classmate, Lillian (Dit) Barsetti Jenks. They had a nice chat.
- 6. The Galt Chamber of Commerce's Hot Air Balloon event at the McFarland was a huge success. They have already rented the McFarland for next year's event on August 10, 11, 2019.
- 7. Kite Day will be April 7th 2019; the weekend before the Civil War Reenactment dates.
- S. Lincoln Highway 2019. In September 2019, the Lincoln Highway Association will be having the reenactment of Eisenhower's trips from the east coast to the west on the Lincoln Highway. They are scheduled to make a stop in Galt about Sept 12. We are still trying to get them to camp the night at the McFarland. More to follow on this.

- 9. Ida reports that May and June 2019 are completely booked on the weekends. The McFarland Living History Ranch continues to get lots of media attention through events such as the Hot Air Balloon event and by word of mouth.
- 10. Event and Learning Center Update: Our engineer has sent out for bids to contractors. Since we do not have all the funds needed to complete the project, it will be done in phases. We are waiting to see the bids. To give you more information, this building will be located to the northeast of the McFarland yard (just south of the red barn). It will be constructed to look like a California A Frame Barn such as existed in early years and also today. It will be about 7600 sq ft. This building will house our extensive archives, be a place for Pioneer Days during inclement weather, and place for more children's activities about early California life, a place for fundraisers and events, and much more. As more develops, we will let you know.
- We are still looking for grant writers to help us seek funds to complete the Event and Learning Center. If you know anyone who might be interested in helping with this, please have them contact Janis.
- 12. Thanks to Dave Olson, he has given us all the historical records and photographs that Genie had stored. This is huge for our archives. Dan will be so busy scanning and filing, we might not see him much. Thank you again Mr. Olson for taking good care of our history.
- 13. We still need sponsors for some of the Historical Markers. It is about \$250 per plaque. Those still needed are for The Herald Store, Hicksville Cemetery, and the Elliott Cemetery. If you want to donate the plaque, please contact Janis or James Guthmiller.
- For those members who are also Galt High Alumni, the All Class Reunion is Saturday Oct 6th at the Littleton. If you need a form to sign up for dinner, contact Janis. Forms must be in by September 22. It is always a great event.


Archival Materials
